

Manager's Message

When it comes to a home's irrigation system, a little maintenance goes a long way. Homes with clock timer-controlled irrigation systems use about 50 percent more water outdoors than homes without irrigation systems. Your system can waste even more if it's programmed incorrectly, a sprinkler head is pointed in the wrong direction, or you have a leak. Before you ramp up your watering efforts, spruce up your irrigation system by remembering four simple steps: inspect, connect, direct, and select.

Community Clean-Up Days June 19th, 20th, and 21st! Check out broadcasts through your homeowner portal! Reminders from the DRC, noting sections found in the governing documents. DRC 1 & 2

Fence Stain

Section 6.1 of DRC No. 1 and Section 7.1 of DRC No.2 of the Design Guidelines states, "Solid wood fencing shall be stained Behr semi-transparent wood stain product #3077 or premium semi-transparent wood stain, weather proofing, product #5077, redwood natural tone color, available at Home Depot on Woodmen Road and Powers Blvd. also referenced as color: Meridian Ranch Brown." This color is available at Home Depot. The Lowe's version is NOT the correct color and is far too red.

If you have recently installed a fence or live in a newer area of the community, your entire solid fence MUST be stained Meridian Ranch Brown, inside and outside, top to bottom, within a reasonable amount of time after installation, weather permitting. If you have an established fence that has been stained in the past, it will need to be re-stained every few years to maintain the correct color. Fences must be maintained in like-new condition, and this includes the color.

The resident who installed the fence is responsible for staining. However, the DRCs recommend speaking with your neighbor(s) to come up with an action plan to stain the fence that will work for all parties and their schedules. If you have questions regarding the fence stain, please contact your DRC.

Weeds

Section 5.4 of DRC No. 1 and Section 6.4 of DRC No. 2 of the Design Guidelines states, "All yards and open spaces and the entire area of every Lot on which no Improvement has been constructed, shall be kept free from plant or weeds infected with noxious insects or plant diseases and from weeds which, in the opinion of the DRC No. 1 [No. 2], are likely to cause the spread of infection or weeds to neighboring property."

All Lots in the community are to be maintained in a weed-free condition to prevent the spread of the weeds. As this year has been particularly snowy and rainy, the weeds are coming up even earlier than normal. If you choose to also spray your weeds, they must also be pulled from the ground. The entire Lot needs to be maintained in a weed-free condition including the rocked areas, landscaped areas, grass areas, etc.

Please also pay attention to ensure your Lot is not growing any Noxious Weeds as defined by El Paso County. You can find more information regarding Noxious Weeds and how to control them in your Homeowner Portal in the Documents > ARC/DRC > Landscape FAQs folder or by visiting the El Paso County website, https://communityservices.elpasoco.com/environmental-division/noxious-weeds/.

Reminder from the Design Guidelines for weeds and dead/diseased trees:

Design Guidelines Section 6.4 Weeds and Diseased Trees:

Per section 3.9 of the CC&R's, "The entire area of every Lot shall be kept free from plant or weeds infected with noxious insects or plant diseases and from weeds which, in the opinion of the Board, are likely to cause the spread of infection or weeds to neighboring property. Trees infected with pine beetles or other diseases shall be removed by the Owner. Removed trees shall be replaced in a timely manner. In addition, each Lot shall be kept free from brush or other growth or trash which, in the reasonable opinion of the Board, is unsightly or causes undue danger of fire.

The entire area of every Lot on which no Improvement has been made shall be kept mowed to a maxioumum height of 6 inches."

The rain this spring has brought weeds to a number of yards, so lets work together to abate the weeds and bring properties into compliance! Dead trees need to be removed and replaced if the lot has less than three trees after removal. Three trees is the minimum requirements for EVERY front yard, no exceptions! Thank you in advance for taking pride in your property and keeping Stonebridge a beautiful place to live!
